17 Motions on notice: Cllr J Beetham-Yelland to move the following motion:

As the parish council's allotments are now seeing more use, they are becoming a target of thieves, and this has resulted in the theft of tools, of animals from the plots, and an increase in illegal hunting, which has culminated in a pet cat being killed and illegal hunting of wildlife escalating, particularly of owls.

As the allotments are primarily used by local people as a source of both leisure and food, and are on private parish property, this council believes that we cannot simply ignore these problems.

Fencing

As it stands, renters are meant to sort their own fencing, but it may behove us to provide fencing to increase security as some of our allotment holders fall into low-income brackets. With the escalating costs of materials, it may well make allotments a luxury that only the more wealthy members of the community can afford to keep, excluding people already struggling during a cost-of-living crisis, particularly large families and disabled people who could do with a safe place to go in nature, and will use the plot for food.

Cornforth Parish Council undertakes to fully investigate the following possible options:

- 1. the parish council pays out-right for fencing around allotments.
- 2. the parish council liaises with existing plot holders and purchases the materials a plot at a time, setting up a payment plan for the plot holder that allows them the materials to build a fence, without having to pay everything upfront.

Signage

Signs have now been designed and temporary versions are in place. These will not however last long.

Cornforth Parish Council undertakes to install a more permanent signage system involving three metal signs of the same type and fitting.

Trail cams

Trail cameras can potentially act as a deterrent to crime, whilst also helping the council put in for environmental grants.

Cornforth Parish Council undertakes to apply for grants to improve the environment and security at its allotments, with Cllr Beetham-Yelland leading on the project.
