2	Declarations of interest

5	Minutes

	It was proposed by Cllr P Metcalfe and seconded by Cllr S Metcalfe, and it was
	Resolved: That the minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 13 October 2025 be agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chair at this meeting, subject to the correction that Cllr P Drew was in attendance.
6	Chair's Announcements
	The Chair reported on Remembrance events in the parish and thanked Cllrs P Metcalfe and R Vaughan for their help including the laying of wreaths at the Remembrance events on behalf of Cornforth Parish Council.
	It was noted that a letter of thanks had been received from the MS Society thanking the parish council for its recent donation.
	It was noted that the problem of the sinkhole on Middleham Road had been rectified by Durham County Council.
	The Chair reported on a recent meeting with a representative of Sovereign Play at which

concerns had been raised regarding trip hazards on the toddler play surface.

It was noted that there had been problems of thefts and killing of animals at the Coxhoe Beck allotments. It was noted that there is no public right of way through the allotment site and that only allotment holders should access it. It was noted that there was likely to be a motion to council on the subject at the December meeting of the council.

It was noted that there would be a meeting with the Interim Change Minister from Holy Trinity Church on 24 November regarding closure of the churchyard. It was noted that the Chair would not be able to attend but that the Clerk would.

Resolved: That the Clerk contact Durham County Council in regard to repair of the toddler play surface and keep County Councillor G Hutchinson informed.

7 County Councillor's report

8 Police And Communities Together (PACT)

It was noted that the police would be carrying out speed awareness work in the parish in the near future. It was noted that Cllr N Coombs was unable to attend the next PACT meeting.

9 Clerk's update

The Clerk had circulated a written report. Topics included renovation of war memorials and 64 High Street.

11 | Financial matters

13 | Security fence, Bill Wilson Memorial Park

It was noted that several local firms had been invited to tender for the work of installing the fence but that this had only resulted in one quote being received. A discussion took place. It was generally thought that the quote looked professional and reasonably priced.

It was proposed by Councillor M Cunningham and seconded by Councillor P Drew and it was:

Resolved: That the council accept the quote as long as the firm is able to carry out the work by the end of February 2026.

14 Policy on unadopted roads

The Clerk had circulated a draft policy incorporating an objective points-based system for determining when the council will intervene in respect of unadopted roads. A discussion took place. It was generally thought that the draft policy provided a good starting point, though fine-tuning would be needed based on experience.

It was proposed by Councillor P Metcalfe and seconded by Councillor M Cunningham and it was;

Resolved: That the council adopt the policy with immediate effect, to be reviewed on an ongoing basis.

15 | Parish newsletter

Cllr J Beetham-Yelland had prepared a draft version of the winter version of the parish newsletter. A discussion took place.

It was proposed by Councillor P Metcalfe and seconded by Councillor S Metcalfe, and it was;

Resolved: That the Chair and Cllr J Beetham-Yelland finalise content this week, with the final version sent to print on 17 November and delivered during the week commencing 24 November.

16 Representation on the County Durham Association of Local Councils (CDALC)

It was noted that Cllr N Coombs wished to step down as one of the parish council representatives on CDALC for personal reasons.

Resolved: That Cllr J Beetham-Yelland replace Cllr N Coombs as representative of the parish council on CDALC, the Clerk to inform CDALC of the change immediately.
